Course Description:

Designed for healthcare providers, this course teaches BLS for all age victims (including ventilation with a barrier device, bag mask, and oxygen); AED use; and foreign body airway obstruction (FBAO) relief in responsive and non-responsive victims.

Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers is presented in accordance with the current American Heart Association (AHA) Guidelines 2010. The BLS for Healthcare Providers Course is intended for participants who must have a credential (a card) documenting successful completion of a course in CPR and BLS for healthcare professionals. Such credentials are typically required for people who provide healthcare to patients in a variety of settings, both in-hospital and outside the hospital.

Current BLS certification is required to attend an initial EMT-Basic class in Colorado; to become certified and maintain certification as an EMS provider at any level in Colorado; and also is required for most other health care related jobs.

Objectives:

At the completion of this course the participant will be able to:

1. Demonstrate CPR for 1 and 2-person rescuer.
2. Demonstrate CPR on child and infant.
3. Manage an obstructed airway on both a conscious and unconscious victim.
4. Perform rescue breathing – adult, child and infant.
5. Demonstrate proper use of defibrillator (AED).
6. Successful complete a written exam and skills test for AHA certification.
