**Course Description:**

This orientation program was developed by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Emergency Medical and Trauma Services Section. The program provides an overview of various federal and state level organizations and authorities which establish the framework for EMS in Colorado; i.e., Department of Transportation (DOT), National Registry of EMTs (NREMT), Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA), etc. It is also designed to orient EMS training and group directors, course coordinators, and primary instructors regarding the statutes, rules and policies governing EMS education centers in Colorado.

**Objectives:**

Upon completion of this course the participant will be able to:

1. Identify the roles and responsibilities of various federal agencies such as the National Highway Safety Transportation Administration (NHSTA), Department of Transportation (DOT) and National Registry of EMTs (NREMT).
2. Describe the role of the Board of Medical Examiners (BME), Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPH&E) and the State Emergency Medical and Trauma Advisor Council (SEMTAC) related to EMS and education within Colorado.
3. Identify current issues regarding initial and continuing EMS education courses.
